

- To provide pedagogical recommendations to educators on how to meet learners' needs.







#### **Eavesdropping at Purgatory**

- Method Design & Procedures
  - 6,000 text messages posted online in a Facebook Page created by students of a Hong Kong self-financed tertiary institution.
  - Adopted the Grounded theory method, texts were coded, categorized & theme searched.
  - A conceptual model built to reflect students' aspirations, learning strategies and outcomes.






#### A Conceptual Model
