Our Accomplishments

- Self-financing institutions have increased tertiary education participation rate to close to 70%
- Total enrollment over 60,000; enrollment for subdegree programmes over 40,000
- Contributing significantly to the knowledged-based economy of Hong Kong
- Satisfying the aspirations of secondary school leavers who cannot get a place in the UGC sector

Challenges

- Negative Stories in the Media
 - Self-financing Sub-degree Programmes (SFSDPs) are of poor quality
 - Further study opportunities for SFSDP graduates are poor
 - Job prospects of SFSDP graduates are poor, as employers do not like to hire SFSDP graduates

Benchmarking with US Community Colleges, and UGC-funded Programmes

- Community Colleges/Associate Degrees originate in USA – the first US Public community college (CC) was founded in 1901
- CCs educate ~45% of all US post-secondary undergraduate students (~13million students)
- There are 1,173 CCs in USA
- "The nation can take pride in what America's community colleges have accomplished"

Quality Indicators People

- Teaching Staff with Doctorate
 - HK ("Big 3"): 27%, ~30%, 41%
 - USA: Wy 5%, Cal 20%, SC 32%
- Student-to-Staff Ratio
 - HK ("Big 3"): 1:26, 1:27, 1:35
 - USA: Wy 1:21, Cal 1:28, SC 1:19

Student Quality

- USA: An "open" admission system
- Hong Kong: must have 22222 in DSE

Articulation Rate

USA

- Wy: 18% graduated, 28% transferred within 3 yrs
- Cal: 49% graduated or transferred within 6 yrs
- SC: over 90% graduated or transferred

HK

- 84%, 73.8%, 73.3% (overall for ADs in 2011-12)
- 32.8%, 32.2%, 25% (to publicly funded places)

Major Aspects of Performance Rated by Employers

- Aspects: Chinese, English, numerical, IT, analytical and problem-solving, work attitude, interpersonal skills, management skills, technical skills for the job
- Self-financing Sub-degree Graduates
 - Average score for all nine aspects above 3.0 (out of 5)
 - Overall score 3.41
- Publicly-funded First Degree Graduates
 - Average score for all nine aspects above 3.0
 - Overall score 3.58

Satisfaction with Overall Performance of Graduates

- Self-financing Sub-degree Graduates
 - Quite Dissatisfied + Very Dissatisfied: 8%
 - Very Satisfied + Quite Satisfied + Average: 92%
- Publicly-funded First Degree Graduates
 - Quite Dissatisfied + Very Dissatisfied: 4%
 - Very Satisfied + Quite Satisfied + Average: 96%

Conclusions

- Hong Kong community colleges compare favourably with US community colleges
 - Our teachers' qualifications are better
 - Our SSR are comparable if not better
 - Our admission requirements are much more stringent
 - Our articulation rates are much better

Conclusions

- Graduates perform well after articulation
 - Those admitted to UGC-funded programmes perform just as well as the FYFD admittees
 - Those admitted to Self-financing top-up degree programmes also perform well
- Employers are generally satisfied with SFSD graduates

Conclusions

- Given the relatively short history
- All operators are non-profit making
- Providing tens of thousands of tertiary education opportunities to young persons in Hong Kong
- Not burdening tax-payers
- Self-financing Institutions in Hong Kong deserve greater public recognition
